TEACHING:

Assistant Professor, Sport Management

Courses Taught:

HONR 342: Power Play: Politics and Sport

- HONR 342 serves as a multinational exploration of the intersections of sport, politics, and power. Students analyze the links between sport and: nationalism; racial inequality; gender inclusion/exclusion; fascism; cultural imperialism; political hegemony; and globalization.

SPMG 260: Principles of Sport Management

- SPMG 260 provides students with a conceptual understanding of sport management and a broad comprehension of sport as a business enterprise. Students explore current practices of sport management as applied to amateur, recreational, collegiate, professional, and international sport programs.

SPMG 270: Sport Governance

- SPMG 270 exposes students to the various governing bodies in amateur, recreational, community, collegiate, and international sport. Students examine and analyze the organizational structure, responsibilities, and functions of various governing entities.

SPMG 275: History of Sport in America

- SPMG 275 uses sport as a lens to understand American history. This class explores the ways in which larger forces and individuals shaped the American sporting experience, as well as the ways in which sport shaped the broader society.

SPMG 350: Gender and Sport—Issues and Controversies

- SPMG 350 offers an introduction to the scholarship and debates that surround historical and contemporary issues of gender and identity in sport. A critical

perspective is used to examine sport as a significant and symbiotic social institution that constructs, reflects and interprets gender and various related identities.

SPMG 353: Sports Law

- SPMG 353 provides students with a broad introduction to the United States' legal system and to the major cases and laws that comprise “sports law.” Students gain a basic comprehension of tort law, constitutional law, antitrust law, and administrative law, as applicable to the sport and recreational industries.

SPMG 398: Sport Broadcasting

- SPMG 398 teaches basic skills in video production and broadcasting with emphasis on sports. Audio, video, lighting, graphics, single and multi-camera technique, and operation are studied and applied. Students gain “hands on” experience with fundamental, terminology, production equipment, and methodology as related to the world of sports broadcasting.

SPMG 415: Internships in Sport Management

- SPMG 415 offers a professional internship with an appropriate sport management organization within the spectrum of the sport industry.

SPMG 420: Sport Ethics and Current Issues

- SPMG 420 examines ethical and moral issues that are central to contemporary sport and physical culture. Students are exposed to concepts of morality and theories of ethical thought while constructing a personal philosophy of social responsibility and a professional code of ethics.

EDU PAES 211: History of Sport, Physical Culture and the Body in Twentieth Century America

- EDU PAES 211 uses sport as a lens to understand American history. This course examines the consequences of industrialization and commercialization; the

significance of sport in higher education, the influences of a consumer society; the role of the media; sport in a global society; and the ever-present implications of class, race and gender

EDU PAES 262: Coaching the Young Athlete

- EDU PAES 262 focuses on themes within youth sport and will address historical, structural, physiological, and psychological concerns with respect to issues in sport for children and youth. A secondary purpose of the class is to help students plan for a sport that they may someday coach.

EDU PAES 626.02: Sport, Race, and Gender in Popular Culture

- EDU PAES 626.02 helps students develop and improve critical analysis of various texts and to learn and understand the historical and social context underlying the current state of gender and race in sport. Specifically this course focuses on divisions in sport, how gender and race are used as both explicit and implicit means to structure sport contests, and to help students become more savvy media and popular culture critics.
